



#### Three critical elements

1. Ensuring harmonization and national standards

2. Working on accountability mechanisms – resource tracking and expenditures

3. Strengthening monitoring and evaluation systems

### UNBUNDLING FUNCTIONS AND ACTIVITIES

Function	Activities
Standard setting and policy	Defining national policy Defining objectives Setting nutritional standards
Planning	Targeting Defining food basket composition Determining number of beneficiaries Establishing criteria for school selection
Financial management	Disbursing funds to appropriate entities
Procurement	Managing tenders Performing quality control of food Purchasing the food (preferably locally) Coordinated with agriculture sector and local farmers
Logistics	Transporting food to distribution points or schools
On-site preparation and feeding of children	Cooking of food Distribution of food to children Managing food stocks
Monitoring and evaluation	Outcome, output and process monitoring Evaluation of program
